When this administration assumed office, it chose not to guess at its priorities. A full baseline assessment was carried out across health, education, security, the economy and administration — an honest audit of where Kaduna South stood, ward by ward. The findings shaped everything that followed: taskforces, action plans, and a sequence of interventions that residents could see and feel.

"The progress you will read on these pages belongs to our people. It is what happens when a local government chooses evidence over assumption, and partnership over distance."

This report gathers, in one place, the work carried out in partnership with His Excellency Governor Uba Sani CON under the SUSTAIN Agenda, localised across all 13 wards of Kaduna South through the Chairman's Six-Point Agenda. It also marks a milestone in the Local Government's own transformation: a new official logo, a new web portal, and — for the first time — a published Administration Scorecard that puts real numbers next to real commitments.

None of it was done alone. It reflects the work of the Vice Chairman, the Legislative Council, appointees, ward officials and staff across the Secretariat, and — above all — the trust of the communities this administration was elected to serve.

70%

Subsidy now applied to medical bills across every Primary Healthcare Centre in Kaduna South.

- + **1,000+ Mama Kits** delivered to pregnant women under the "100 Kits a Month" programme.
- + **1,000 residents** enrolled in KADCHMA, extending affordable healthcare cover beyond PHC walls.
- + Bi-monthly **sanitation exercises** reintroduced to keep wards clean, alongside re-electrified PHCs with solar power and cooling for round-the-clock vaccine storage.
- + One Primary Healthcare Centre upgraded to a **Centre of Excellence**, now offering specialist tertiary-level care; a new facility is under construction in **Tudun Nupawa** to relieve overcrowding.
- + Free **cataract surgeries** delivered in partnership with the Muslim World League, and a new **toll-free feedback line** for citizens to rate the care they receive.
- + Monthly **nutrition support** — RUTF, Tamowa and Kunun Lafiya — for malnourished children, backed by strengthened SIMEN centres and a closer partnership with the Federal Neuro-Psychiatric Hospital, Barnawa, for mental health and drug-rehabilitation support.
- + Ward Development Committees restructured with genuinely committed community members; the Livestock Development Project is modernising the **Zango Veterinary Clinic**.

Teacher-to-student ratio today, improved from 1 teacher to 90 pupils at the start of this administration.

- + Over **1,000 sets of school benches** distributed so far through the "100 Benches a Month" project — running every month until every child sits in comfort.
- + Public schools rehabilitated with new fencing and renovated classrooms, giving the improved teacher-student ratio room to hold.
- + **NYSC Corps members** deployed with stipends and accommodation to strengthen teaching capacity and STEM education.
- + Over **1,000 students** sponsored for JAMB and NECO; monthly stipends introduced for education officers.
- + The local government's Smart Model School reinforced with additional teachers, health workers, nannies and cleaners, under a dedicated Education Joint Task Force monitoring every intervention.
- + School-Based Management Committees restructured with credible community members; free books and teaching aids distributed, and a solar-powered borehole and WASH facility built at LEA Kagoro Road.
- + New skills partnerships with **Kaduna Polytechnic and NBTE**, backed by Governor Uba Sani, training youths for National Skills Qualification certification — with a second cycle planned.

Security

3 new laws

Passed to protect lives, business and public infrastructure.

- + The **Prohibition of Iron Scavenging Bye-Law**, agreed with Panteka Market leadership, sharply cutting iron theft.
- + The **Security Development Fund Bye-Law**, creating a public-private trust fund for community security.
- + The **Tricycle Riders Registration Law**, reducing crime and giving local business room to operate without fear.
- + KADVS Special Protection Unit trained and equipped, with new outposts at key flashpoints and security personnel posted at PHCs and schools.
- + Monthly Security Council meetings held with agencies, traditional rulers and community leaders.

Economic Development

2,600+ farmers

Reached with fertiliser at a 95% success rate, under the Governor's Agricultural Support Initiative.

- + Farmers equipped with solar-powered water pumps and tools; food palliatives distributed to families across the LGA.
- + Cash business support delivered to over **500 women and youth** across all 13 wards.
- + Over **60 informal transport workers** formalised into jobs, working with local businesses to move youth off the streets.
- + Coaches and athletes supported into professional training and scouting; the Nigerian Coaches Association's Kaduna chapter inaugurated to revive local talent.
- + Solar-powered boreholes installed and hand pumps rehabilitated for drinking water in all wards; monthly allowances introduced for cemetery workers, alongside a new death-registration system.

Safer markets and streets are the foundation every local business needs.

1st & 3rd

Kaduna South is the first Local Government in the North-West, and third in Nigeria, to join the Open Government Partnership.

- + A new **OGP Local Action Plan** focused on healthcare and accountability now guides reforms.
- + Digital **Certificates of Indigene** issued with verifiable barcodes; the LGA Secretariat rehabilitated.
- + Inclusive advisory committees formed with former chairmen, technocrats, traditional rulers, youth and women.
- + A new official website, professional email system, secure cloud storage, QR verification, and live dashboards now running in Primary Healthcare Centres.
- + An active presence across social media platforms, built to widen citizen participation and transparency.
